## Pesticides Act 1999

## Revocation of a Pesticide Control Order issued under section 38

#### **Name**

1. This Order is to be known as the Mevinphos Revocation Order 2020.

## **Authority for Order**

1. This Order is made by the Environment Protection Authority with the approval of the Minister for Energy and Environment under Part 4 of the *Pesticides Act 1999*.

## **Purpose**

- 2. The purpose of this Order is to revoke the Pesticide Control (Mevinphos) Order 2003 issued under section 38 of the *Pesticides Act 1999*.
- 3. Mevinphos (e.g. Phosdrin Insecticide) can no longer be used in NSW.

#### Order revoked

4. The Pesticide Control (Mevinphos) Order 2003, published in NSW Government Gazette No. 81, 2 May 2003, pages 4640 – 4641, is revoked.

#### **Date of Revocation**

5. This Order takes effect on the date it is published in the NSW Government Gazette.

### **Definitions**

6. In this Order -

Mevinphos means any chemical product containing mevinphos.

Use includes possess.
