# MINISTERIAL ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 19

# Ministerial (Labour Day Double Demerit Point Exemption) Order 2021

I, Andrew Constance, Minister for Transport and Roads, pursuant to section 19(1) of the *Road Transport Act 2013* (NSW), make the following Order.

#### 1. Name of Order

This Order is the *Ministerial (Labour Day Double Demerit Point Exemption) Order* 2021

#### 2. Commencement

This Order has effect on and from 1 October 2021 and remains in force up to and including 4 October 2021, unless revoked earlier.

#### 3. Interpretation

Words and expressions used in this Order have the same meaning as in the *Road Transport Act 2013* unless otherwise stated.

# 4. Declaration

Clauses 71(3) to (4) of the Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2017 are declared not to apply to a driver.

#### 5. Publication

The Order is to be published in the NSW Government Gazette.

### **Explanatory note:**

The object of this Order is to exclude double demerit points applying to drivers during the Labour Day long weekend period in 2021 for double demerit point offences. Demerit points usually applied during non-long weekend periods will still apply.
