REGULATION OF VESSELS – EXCLUSION ZONE

Location

Shoalhaven River, Shoalhaven Heads – within a 200m radius of a barge positioned approximately 100m south east of the foreshore of 55 River Road, Shoalhaven Heads

Duration

• 7.00pm to 11.00pm - Friday 31 December 2021

Detail

A fireworks display will be conducted on the navigable waters of Shoalhaven River, Shoalhaven Heads specified above, and will involve the use of a stationary barge as a platform for the display.

An **EXCLUSION ZONE** is specified during the event, and will be indicated by the presence of onshore staff and a patrol vessel stationed on the perimeter of the zone. The Zone will be marked by local signage and monitored by Maritime vessels.

Unauthorised vessels and persons are strictly prohibited from entering the Exclusion Zone.

Penalties may apply (section 12(5) - Marine Safety Act 1998)

REGULATION OF VESSELS – EXCLUSION ZONE

Location

Sydney Harbour – Sydney Cove

Duration

9.50pm to 10.25pm on Saturday 1 to Wednesday 5 January 2022 (inclusive)

Detail

A skyshow event will be conducted on the waters of Sydney Cove at the location specified above, and will comprise a barge alongside the northern Overseas Passenger Terminal used as a launch and landing location for the drones.

An Exclusion Zone will be established across the mouth of Sydney Cove from the Port lateral mark off the Sydney Opera House Seawall to the Port Lateral mark off Dawes Point. All vessels in Sydney Cove will be advised to stay alongside and all vessels wishing to enter Sydney Cove will be advised to hold.

Maritime vessels will be stationed on the above line and will communicate the activation and deactivation of the Exclusion Zone over VHF 13 to Sydney VTS.

Unauthorised vessels and persons are strictly prohibited from entering the Exclusion Zone which will be monitored by Maritime patrol vessels.

REGULATION OF VESSELS - EXCLUSION ZONE AND SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS

Location

Lower Coolongolook River/ Cape Hawke Harbour/ Wallis Lake, Forster NSW - Forster/ Tuncurry Bridge/ Miles Island/ Little Tern Island

Duration

• 8.30pm to 9.30pm – Friday 31 December 2021

Detail

A fireworks display will be conducted on the navigable waters of Lower Coolongolook River/ Cape Hawke Harbour/ Wallis Lake, Forster NSW specified above.

An **EXCLUSION ZONE** is specified during the event, 250 metres around the fireworks deployment barge and will be patrolled by Maritime and Police vessels.

Unauthorised vessels and persons are strictly prohibited from entering the Exclusion Zone.

SPECIAL RESTRICTION

Pursuant to section 12(3) of the Marine Safety Act 1998, vessels navigating in the vicinity of the Forster/Tuncurry Bridge

- must not exceed a speed of 4 knots and
- must produce no wash.

Penalties may apply (section 12(5) - Marine Safety Act 1998)
