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Anti-Discrimination Act 1977

EXEMPTION ORDER

Under the provisions of section 126 of the *Anti-Discrimination Act* 1977 (NSW), an exemption is given from sections 8 and 51 of the *Anti-Discrimination Act* 1977 (NSW) to Coffs Harbour City Council to advertise, designate and recruit Trainee Environmental Health Officer positions for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander persons only.

This exemption will remain in force for 10 years.

LAW SOCIETY OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS SCHEME

PREAMBLE

- A. The Law Society of South Australia ("the Society") is an occupational association.
- B. The Society has made an application to the Professional Standards Council, established by the *Professional Standards Act 2004* (SA) for approval of a scheme under the Act.
- C. The Scheme is prepared by the Society for the purposes of limiting occupational liability of its participants to the extent to which such liability may be limited under the Act.
- D. The Scheme propounded by the Society applies to Admitted Members and Company Members of the Society who have professional indemnity insurance that complies with the approved Insurance Standard.
- E. The Society has furnished the Professional Standards Council with a detailed list of the risk management strategies intended to be implemented in respect of its members and the means by which those strategies are intended to be implemented.
- F. The Scheme is to commence on 1 July 2022 and remain in force for five (5) years from its commencement unless, prior to that time, it is revoked, its operation ceases, or it is extended.
- G. The Scheme is intended to apply in all States and Territories within Australia.
- H. The Scheme only applies to Admitted Members holding an Australian practising certificate, and Company Members, in the practise of domestic law within Australia.
- I. The Scheme will have force in South Australia and, if relevant, the other jurisdictions in which the Scheme will apply under the provisions for mutual recognition contained in the Act. To the extent that the Scheme applies to limit liability in the other jurisdictions, it is subject to the professional standards legislation of those jurisdictions.
- J. Section 12GNA(2) of the Australian Securities and Investments Commission Act 2001 (Cth); section 137(2) of the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (Cth); and section 1044B(2) of the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth) provide for limited liability in respect of actions for contravention of certain provisions, but only where a professional standards scheme is prescribed in the relevant regulation. The Scheme does not apply to limit any liability under a Commonwealth law unless the Scheme has been prescribed by the Commonwealth.

The Law Society of South Australia Professional Standards Scheme

1. Definitions

"Act" means the Professional Standards Act 2004 (SA);

"Admitted Member" means a person who is or was at the Relevant Time an Admitted Member within the meaning of and pursuant to the Rules of the Society;

"Company Member" means a company who is or was at the Relevant Time a Company Member within the meaning of and pursuant to the Rules of the Society;

"Corresponding Law" means a law of another State or Territory of Australia that corresponds to the Act, including for the avoidance of doubt:

- (a) Professional Standards Act 1994 (NSW);
- (b) Professional Standards Act 2004 (Qld);
- (c) Professional Standards Act 2003 (Vic);
- (d) Professional Standards Act 1997 (WA);
- (e) Professional Standards Act 2005 (Tas);
- (f) Professional Standards Act 2004 (NT); and
- (g) Civil Law (Wrongs) Act 2002 (ACT);

"Court" has the same meaning as it has in the Act;

"Damages" has the same meaning as it has in the Act;

"Duration of the Scheme" means the period commencing on the date specified in clause 7.1 and ending upon the cessation of the Scheme pursuant to clause 7.2;

"Exempted Member" means an Admitted Member or Company Member who is or was at the Relevant Time exempted by the Society from participation in the Scheme pursuant to clause 4.3;

"Insurance Standard" means the Insurance Standard approved by the Society on 21 June 2021;

"Legal Practitioners Act" means the Legal Practitioners Act 1981 (SA) or any act enacted in substitution thereof;

"Monetary Ceiling" means, in respect of a liability in respect of a cause of action founded on an act or omission occurring after the commencement of the Scheme:

2. Occupational Association

2.1. The Scheme is a scheme under the Act prepared and conducted by the Society whose business address is Level 10, 178 North Terrace, Adelaide, South Australia.

3. Jurisdictions in which the Scheme Applies

- 3.1. The Scheme applies in South Australia pursuant to the Act.
- 3.2. The Scheme applies in New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Western Australia, Tasmania, the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory pursuant to the Corresponding Laws of each of those jurisdictions respectively.
- 3.3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Scheme, if in particular circumstances giving rise to Occupational Liability, the liability of any person who is subject to this Scheme should be capped by both this Scheme and also by any other scheme under professional standards legislation (whether of this jurisdiction or under the law of any other Australian State or Territory) and if the amount of such caps should differ, then the cap on the liability of such person arising from such circumstances which is higher shall be the applicable

[&]quot;Person" means an individual or a body corporate;

[&]quot;Relevant Time" means, in respect of a liability potentially limited by the Scheme, the time(s) of the act(s) or omission(s) giving rise to the liability;

[&]quot;the Scheme" means the Law Society of South Australia Scheme constituted herein;

[&]quot;Scheme Participant" means a person referred to in clause 4.1 or 4.2;

[&]quot;the Society" means the Law Society of South Australia.

4. Persons to Whom the Scheme Applies

- 4.1. The Scheme applies to all persons who:
 - 4.1.1. are or at the Relevant Time were Admitted Members holding a current practicing certificate or Company Members of the Society;
 - 4.1.2. are or were at the Relevant Time not Exempted Members; and
 - 4.1.3. have professional indemnity insurance that complies with the Insurance Standard of the Society.
- 4.2. The Scheme applies to all persons to whom the Scheme applies by virtue of sections 20, 21, and 22 of the Act and any Corresponding Laws. The Society may, upon application by an Admitted Member or Company Member, exempt that person from participation in the Scheme with effect from a date specified by the Society on or after the date on which the exemption is granted.
- 4.3. The Society may, upon application by an Admitted Member or Company Member, revoke an exemption of that person from participation in the Scheme with effect from a date specified by the Society.

5. Conferral of Discretionary Authority

5.1. The Scheme confers on the Society a discretionary authority, on application by a Scheme Participant, to specify in relation to the person a higher maximum amount of liability than would otherwise apply under the Scheme in relation to the person either in all cases or in any specified case or class of case, being a specified amount not exceeding \$50 million.

6. Limitation of Liability

- 6.1 The Occupational Liability of a person who is, or at the Relevant Time was, a Scheme Participant in respect of a cause of action founded on an act or omission occurring during the Duration of the Scheme is limited to the amount of the applicable Monetary Ceiling.
- 6.2 The liability which is limited by clause 6.1 extends to a liability for Damages but excludes a liability to which the Act does not apply from time to time by reason of section 5 thereof or, if the liability is governed by a Corresponding Law, excludes a liability to which the Corresponding Law does not apply from time to time by reason of its provisions.
- 6.3 The operation of clause 6.1 limiting the liability of a person is subject to the proviso that the person is able to satisfy the Court that:

- 6.3.1 the person has the benefit of an insurance policy or policies in accordance with the Insurance Standard insuring the person against the Occupational Liability to which the cause of action relates; and
- 6.3.2 the amount payable under the policy or policies in respect of that occupational liability is not less than the amount of the applicable Monetary Ceiling.
- 6.4 The limitation of liability that, in accordance with this Scheme and the Acts, applies in respect of an act or omission continues to apply to every cause of action founded on it, irrespective of when the proceedings are brought in respect of it, and even if the Scheme has been amended or has ceased to be in force.
- 6.5 For the purposes of section 28 of the Act, and corresponding provisions in corresponding laws, the Scheme only affects a liability for Damages arising from a single claim (including a claim by a person who has 2 or more causes of action arising out of a single event) exceeding \$1,500,000.

7. Commencement and Duration of the Scheme

- 7.1. The Scheme will commence:
 - 7.1.1 in New South Wales, the Northern Territory, Tasmania, Western Australia, Victoria and Queensland on 1 July 2022; and
 - 7.1.2 in South Australia and the Australian Capital Territory:
 - 7.1.2.1 on this same date or such other later date as may be specified in the relevant Minister's notice in relation to the Scheme; or
 - 7.1.2.2 If no date is specified in the relevant Minister's notice, on the first day two months after the date of the publication of the Minister's notice.
- 7.2. The Scheme will be in force in South Australia for a period of five years from the date of its commencement in that jurisdiction.
- 7.3. For any other jurisdiction, the Scheme will be in force for:
 - 7.3.1 five years from the date of commencement in that jurisdiction; or
 - 7.3.2 five years from the date of commencement in South Australia; whichever period ends first.
- 7.4. Clauses 7.2 and 7.3 are subject to the provisions of the Act and the Corresponding Law in each jurisdiction in relation to the revocation, extension or cessation of a scheme.

Explanatory note

Under clause 5A of the Motor Dealers and Repairers Regulation 2014, the Minister for Better Regulation and Innovation may, by order published in the Gazette, declare that a specified event, held at a place where a number of motor dealers, motor vehicle manufacturers or other industry participants display motor vehicles, is a declared trade show.

The object of this Order is to declare the Central West Caravan Camping & Outdoor Expo to be held at the Australian National Field Days site, 563 Borenore Road, Borenore, NSW 2800 to be a declared trade show for the period of 11 February 2022 to 13 February 2022 (inclusive). The effect of the Order is to exempt motor dealers whose ordinary place of business is outside NSW from the need to hold a NSW motor dealer's licence in order to offer or display a motor vehicle for sale at the Central West Caravan Camping & Outdoor Expo. To receive the benefit of the exemption, eligible persons will need to satisfy the conditions of this Order and the Regulation.

The exemption will have effect only for the duration of the trade show and applies to participation in the Central West Caravan Camping & Outdoor Expo only to the extent that it involves advising persons with respect to the quality, performance and characteristics of motor vehicles and making offers to, or receiving offers from, persons to enter into agreements for the sale of motor vehicles (other than second-hand motor vehicles).

1. Name of Order

This Order is the Motor Dealers and Repairers (Declaration of Declared Trade Show – Central West Caravan Camping & Outdoor Expo) Order 2022.

2. Commencement

This Order commences on the day on which it is published in the NSW Government Gazette.

3. Definitions

In this Order:

Eligible person has the same meaning given to it in clause 5A of the Regulation.

The **Central West Caravan Camping & Outdoor Expo** means the Central West Caravan Camping & Outdoor Expo held at the Australian National Field Days site, 563 Borenore Road, Borenore, NSW 2800.

Second-hand motor vehicle has the same meaning given to it in the Act.

The Act means the Motor Dealers and Repairers Act 2013.

The Regulation means the Motor Dealers and Repairers Regulation 2014.

4. Declaration of Declared Trade Show

Central West Caravan Camping & Outdoor Expo is declared to be a declared trade show for the period beginning at 12:01am on 11 February 2022 and ending at 11:59pm 13 February 2022.

5. Conditions

An eligible person must comply with the following conditions and the Regulation in order to receive the benefit of the exemption conferred by this Order:

- (a) when making offers to, or receiving offers from, persons to enter into agreements for the sale of motor vehicles (other than second-hand motor vehicles) an eligible person must advise those persons in writing:
 - i. that the sale will be effected in the jurisdiction where the eligible person's ordinary place of business is;
 - ii. that the sale will not be subject to the dealer obligations or consumer protections provided under the Act or the Regulation;
 - iii. that the sale will be subject to the relevant dealer obligations, if any, or consumer protections that apply in the jurisdiction where the eligible person's ordinary place of business is;
 - iv. consumer protection under the Australian Consumer Law extends across all state and territory boundaries;
 - v. where the pick-up location would be for the vehicle if a sale is effected; and
 - vi. where the location would be for servicing and repair work for the vehicle if a sale is effected:
 - vii. of information regarding extended warranties including matters such as the location of servicing and repair work for these warranties.
- (b) display a sign at the stall or other place of business operated by the eligible person at the declared trade show that:
 - i. uses language and a format, and is in a position, that makes the sign easy to read by any person approaching the stall or place, and
 - ii. includes the registered business name, or company name, address and inter-State or Territory licence name or number (if applicable) of the business ordinarily operated by the eligible person, and
 - iii. identifies the eligible person as a person who ordinarily operates an interstate or Territory business, and
 - iv. states that the contract of sale must be signed outside of New South Wales.

5. Conditions

An eligible person must comply with the following conditions and the Regulation in order to receive the benefit of the exemption conferred by this Order:

 - i. that the sale will be effected in the jurisdiction where the eligible person's ordinary place of business is;
 - ii. that the sale will not be subject to the dealer obligations or consumer protections provided under the Act or the Regulation;
 - iii. that the sale will be subject to the relevant dealer obligations, if any, or consumer protections that apply in the jurisdiction where the eligible person's ordinary place of business is;
 - iv. consumer protection under the Australian Consumer Law extends across all state and territory boundaries;
 - v. where the pick-up location would be for the vehicle if a sale is effected; and
 - vi. where the location would be for servicing and repair work for the vehicle if a sale is effected;
 - vii. of information regarding extended warranties including matters such as the location of servicing and repair work for these warranties.
- (b) display a sign at the stall or other place of business operated by the eligible person at the declared trade show that:

- **"Experience"** means experience lawfully gained by the applicant (whether during or after completion of an Apprenticeship) in Australia as a *bona fide* employee who has been paid during the relevant period of employment in accordance with an award or enterprise agreement, and this is verified in the Relevant Application Form;
- "Evidence of Employment" means relevant documents in accordance with the relevant award or enterprise agreement;
- "Registered Training Organisation" has the same meaning as in the National Vocational Education and Training Regulator Act 2011 (Cth);
- "Relevant Application Form" means the relevant application form for the supervisor or tradesperson certificate or endorsed contractor licence that is being applied for, which is published on the NSW Fair Trading website, including the required attachments to that form. (Note Applications are to be made in accordance with section 12 of the *Licensing and Registration (Uniform Procedures) Act 2002*).

Explanatory note

The Commissioner for Fair Trading, Department of Customer Service is at the date of this instrument the "Secretary" under the Home Building Act 1989 and the Home Building Regulation 2014. See paragraph (a) of the definition of "Secretary" in clause 1(1) of Schedule 1 to the Home Building Act 1989.

Interpretation

In this Instrument:

"the Act" means the Home Building Act 1989;

"Australian University" has the same meaning as in the Higher Education Act 2001 or successor legislation in force for the time being providing for the recognition of Australian universities;

references to "Certificate" and "Licence" are respectively to a supervisor certificate, or endorsed contractor licence, as defined in the Act to do or supervise general building work;

"**Degree**" means a degree of any kind, and in particular includes the degrees of doctor, master and bachelor but excludes an associate degree or honorary degree;

The reference to a "**Diploma**" in Item 8 in Table D of Schedule 1, does not include a Diploma of: Building; Construction; Construction Management; Construction Economics; Applied Science (Building); Structural Engineering; or Quantity Surveying. On every other occasion the term "Diploma" is used in this Instrument it is to be given its ordinary meaning;

"Experience" means experience gained by the applicant as:

- (a) an employee of; or
- (b) a holder of a supervisor certificate and as a nominated supervisor for the contractor licence held by; or
- (c) a holder of an endorsed contractor licence contracted to; or
- (d) a holder of a supervisor certificate in the capacity of a nominated supervisor for a contractor licence held by an individual, partnership or corporationcontracted to; or

the holder of a contractor licence authorising the holder to do the class of residential building work in which the experience was gained ("the Work"), where the applicant, during the relevant period, was:

- supervised and directed in the doing of the Work by the holder of an endorsed contractor licence or supervisor certificate authorising its holder to supervise the Work, and this is verified in the Relevant Application Form; and
- received Remuneration in accordance with law for the Work which the applicant out; or
- (e) a holder of a supervisor certificate in the category of full general building work or an endorsed contractor licence in the category of full general building work, held continuously for a minimum period of 2 years within 10 years from the date the application is made;

"Relevant Application Form" means the relevant application form for the Licence or Certificate that is being applied for, which is published on the NSW Fair Trading website, including the required attachments to that form. (Note – Applications are to be made in accordance with section 12 of the Licensing and Registration (Uniform Procedures) Act 2002);

"Registered Training Organisation" has the same meaning as in the National Vocational Education and Training Regulator Act 2011 (Cth);

the reference to "Schedule 1" includes the tables in Schedule 1;

"TAFE" means the New South Wales Technical and Further Education Commission.

"Remuneration" means wages, salary and director's fees paid to an applicant on a regular basis, but does not include bonuses, commissions, allowances or any other ad-hoc payments, including payments from a profit-sharing arrangement between the applicant and any another party, where such payments are the only payments made to the applicant for the Work which the applicant carried out.

Disconnection and reconnection work does not include work:

- that is otherwise defined by the Regulation to be the associated electrical work under the categories of Air Conditioning and Refrigeration
- on new installations or the alteration of fixed wiring
- where high fault currents are possible
- on complex electrical apparatus and circuits
- associated with fixed wiring other than disconnecting and reconnecting electrical
 equipment this exclusion includes locating and rectifying faults of circuits at a
 switchboard or to general electrical accessories (including switches, socket outlets,
 circuit protective devices); or installation of or alteration to any part of the fixed electrical
 wiring system (defined as electrical wiring work)
- on fixed wired smoke detectors
- on electric hot water systems except when carried by the holder of <u>a plumbing</u> (or water plumbing) endorsed licence or qualified supervisor certificate
- on luminaires including pre-assembled neon signs
- installing lifts, inclinators and turntables, and
