It is hereby notified, for general information, that Her Excellency the Governor, has, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, this day assented to the under mentioned Acts passed by the Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, viz.:

Act No. 5 — An Act to amend a number of Acts to permanently implement regulatory reforms relating to particular measures previously implemented temporarily as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic; to amend the *Constitution Act 1902* and the *Constitution (COVID-19 Emergency Measures) Regulation 2020* to extend particular provisions; and to amend the *Interpretation Act 1987* to clarify the requirements for tabling documents in a House of Parliament. **[COVID-19 and Other Legislation Amendment (Regulatory Reforms) Bill]**

Act No. 6 — An Act to amend the *Health Practitioner Regulation (Adoption of National Law) Act 2009*, the *Health Services Act 1997*, the *Mental Health Act 2007*, the *Mental Health and Cognitive Impairment Forensic Provisions Act 2020*, the *Private Health Facilities Act 2007*, the *Public Health Act 2010* and the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1989* for particular purposes. **[Health Legislation (Miscellaneous) Amendment Bill]**

**Motor Dealers and Repairers (Declaration of Declared Trade Show – Primex Field Days Show)
Order 2022**

under the

Motor Dealers and Repairers Regulation 2014

I, Eleni Petinos, Minister for Small Business, Minister for Fair Trading, in pursuance of clause 5A of the Motor Dealers and Repairers Regulation 2014, make the following Order.

Explanatory note

Under clause 5A of the Motor Dealers and Repairers Regulation 2014, the Minister for Fair Trading may, by order published in the Gazette, declare that a specified event, held at a place where a number of motor dealers, motor vehicle manufacturers or other industry participants display motor vehicles, is a declared trade show.

The object of this Order is to declare the Primex Field Days Show to be held at Richmond Valley Events Centre, Bruxner Highway, Casino NSW 2470 to be a declared trade show for the period of 19 May 2022 to 21 May 2022 (inclusive). The effect of the Order is to exempt motor dealers whose ordinary place of business is outside NSW from the need to hold a NSW motor dealer's licence in order to offer or display a motor vehicle for sale at the Primex Field Days Show. To receive the benefit of the exemption, eligible persons will need to satisfy the conditions of this Order and the Regulation.

The exemption will have effect only for the duration of the trade show and applies to participation in the Primex Field Days Show only to the extent that it involves advising persons with respect to the quality, performance and characteristics of motor vehicles and making offers to, or receiving offers from, persons to enter into agreements for the sale of motor vehicles (other than second-hand motor vehicles).

1 Name of Order

This Order is the Motor Dealers and Repairers (Declaration of Declared Trade Show – Primex Field Days Show) Order 2022.

2 Commencement

This Order commences on the day on which it is published in the NSW Government Gazette.

3 Definitions

In this Order:

Eligible person has the same meaning given to it in clause 5A of the Regulation.

The **Primex Field Days Show** means the Primex Field Days Show held at Richmond Valley Events Centre, Bruxner Highway, Casino NSW 2470.

Second-hand motor vehicle has the same meaning given to it in the Act.

The Act means the *Motor Dealers and Repairers Act 2013*.

The Regulation means the *Motor Dealers and Repairers Regulation 2014*.

4 Declaration of Declared Trade Show

The Primex Field Days Show is declared to be a declared trade show for the period beginning at 12:01am on 19 May 2022 and ending at 11:59pm 21 May 2022.

5 Conditions

An eligible person must comply with the following conditions and the Regulation in order to receive the benefit of the exemption conferred by this Order:

- a) when making offers to, or receiving offers from, persons to enter into agreements for the sale of motor vehicles (other than second-hand motor vehicles) an eligible person must advise those persons in writing:
 - i. that the sale will be effected in the jurisdiction where the eligible person's ordinary place of business is;
 - ii. that the sale will not be subject to the dealer obligations or consumer protections provided under the Act or the Regulation;
 - iii. that the sale will be subject to the relevant dealer obligations, if any, or consumer protections that apply in the jurisdiction where the eligible person's ordinary place of business is;
 - iv. consumer protection under the Australian Consumer Law extends across all state and territory boundaries;
 - v. where the pick-up location would be for the vehicle if a sale is effected; and
 - vi. where the location would be for servicing and repair work for the vehicle if a sale is effected;
 - vii. of information regarding extended warranties including matters such as the location of servicing and repair work for these warranties.

- b) display a sign at the stall or other place of business operated by the eligible person at the declared trade show that:
 - i. uses language and a format, and is in a position, that makes the sign easy to read by any person approaching the stall or place, and
 - ii. includes the registered business name, or company name, address and inter-State or Territory licence name or number (if applicable) of the business ordinarily operated by the eligible person, and
 - iii. identifies the eligible person as a person who ordinarily operates an interstate or Territory business, and
 - iv. states that the contract of sale must be signed outside of New South Wales.
