REGULATION OF VESSELS - EXCLUSION ZONE

Location

Lake Illawarra, Kanahooka – Koonawarra Bay, between Elizabeth Point and Kanahooka Point

Duration

8.00am to 5.00pm on the following dates:

Saturday 13 and Sunday 14 August 2022

Detail

A competitive water ski race will be conducted on the navigable waters of Lake Illawarra specified above. This will involve the use of powered vessels, persons being towed at speed using tow lines and the possibility of persons in the water from time to time, presenting a potential hazard to other water ways users.

An **EXCLUSION ZONE** is specified during the event, which will be marked by buoys and monitored by control vessels. There will also be support vessels present to manage the event.

Unauthorised vessels and persons are strictly prohibited from entering the Exclusion Zone.

Penalties may apply (section 12(5) - Marine Safety Act 1998)

This Notice remains in force up to and including the repeal of Part 15 of the Road Rules 2014 unless revoked or amended earlier.

4 Interpretation

Words and expressions used in this Notice have the same meaning as in the Road Rules 2014 unless otherwise stated.

5 Exemption of the operation of road rule 262-1

Riders of electric scooters are exempt from road rule 262-1 on roads within The Australian Botanic Garden Mount Annan depicted by a heavy unbroken yellow line at Schedule 1 to this Notice.


6 Publication

1 Name of Notice

This Notice is the *Electric Scooter Use Area Exemption (Western Sydney Parklands) Notice 2022.*

2 Commencement

This Notice has effect on and from the 29 July 2022.

3 Effect

This Notice remains in force up to and including the repeal of Part 15 of the Road Rules 2014 unless revoked or amended earlier.

4 Interpretation

Words and expressions used in this Notice have the same meaning as in the Road Rules 2014 unless otherwise stated.

5 Exemption of the operation of road rule 262-1

Riders of electric scooters are exempt from road rule 262-1 on the following roads within the land comprising the Western Sydney Parklands:

- (a) The Shale Hills Loop, as indicated by a heavy broken orange line in Schedule 1 to this Notice,
- (b) The Bungarribee Trail, as indicated by a heavy broken orange line in Schedule 2 to this Notice,
- (c) The Moonrise Loop, as indicated by a heavy broken orange line in Schedule 3 to this Notice,
- (d) The Pimelea Loop, as indicated by a heavy unbroken orange line in Schedule 3 to this Notice, and
- (e) The roads surrounding The Dairy, as indicated by a heavy broken orange line in Schedule 4.

6 Publication

This Notice is to be published in the NSW Government Gazette.





ROAD TRANSPORT ACT 2013

MINISTERIAL ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 19

Ministerial (Visiting Heavy Vehicle Driver Residency Period) Exemption Order 2022

I, Samuel Farraway, Minister for Regional Transport and Roads, pursuant to section 19(1) of the *Road Transport Act 2013*, make this Order.

1. Citation

This Order is the *Ministerial (Visiting Heavy Vehicle Driver Residency Period)*Exemption Order 2022.

2. Commencement

This Order has effect on and from 1 August 2022.

3. Effect

This Order remains in force up to and including 31 July 2023 unless revoked earlier.

4. Interpretation

Words and expressions used in this Order have the same meaning as in the *Road Transport Act 2013* unless otherwise stated.

"Regulation" means the Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2017

"Visiting driver" means a driver who holds a driver licence issued from New Zealand or another Australian jurisdiction other than NSW.

5. Application

This Order applies to visiting drivers who hold a driver licence equivalent to a NSW light rigid vehicle licence; medium rigid vehicle licence; heavy rigid vehicle licence; heavy combination vehicle licence, or multi-combination vehicle licence and who have resided in NSW for a continuous period of more than three (3) months.

6. Declaration

A visiting driver to which this Order applies is exempt from clause 96(4)(a) of the Regulation in relation to driving a class of motor vehicle permitted by their driver licence for a further period of nine (9) months so long as they continuously reside in NSW for that period, subject to any conditions.

7. Conditions

If the visiting driver is a New Zealand driver licence holder and operates a vehicle for which a multi-combination vehicle driver licence is required that visiting driver must:

- (a) provide Transport for NSW with written evidence of being eligible to drive multiple-combination vehicles in the jurisdiction where their driver licence is issued from; and
- (b) The visiting driver must undergo a medical examination in accordance with clause 60(1)(c) and (d) of the Regulation.

8. Publication

This Order is to be published in the NSW Government Gazette.

Explanatory notes:

Clause 96(4)(a) of the Regulation provides that certain visiting drivers who reside in NSW for a continuous period of longer than three (3) months must obtain a NSW driver licence.

This Order extends the three-month period under which a visiting driver may continue to drive on their New Zealand or interstate light rigid vehicle driver licence, medium rigid vehicle driver licence, heavy rigid vehicle driver licence, heavy combination vehicle driver licence, or multi-combination vehicle driver licence, therefore exempting those driver licence holders from the requirement to obtain a NSW driver licence for a total period of 12 months from the date the visiting driver commenced residing in NSW.
