In pursuance of section 37(1)(b) of the *Heritage Act 1977 (NSW)*, the Heritage Council gives notice that the item of environmental heritage specified in Schedule "A" has been listed on the State Heritage Register in accordance with the decision of the Minister for Environment and Heritage made on 7<sup>th</sup> February 2022 to direct the listing. ## HERITAGE ACT 1977

### ORDER UNDER SECTION 57(2) TO GRANT SITE SPECIFIC EXEMPTIONS FROM APPROVAL

#### Billagoe (Mount Drysdale) Cultural Landscape via Cobar

#### SHR No. 02057

I, the Minister administering the *Heritage Act 1977*, on the recommendation of the Heritage Council of New South Wales, in pursuance of section 57(2) of the *Heritage Act 1977*, do, by this my order, grant an exemption from section 57(1) of that Act in respect of the engaging in or carrying out of any activities described in Schedule “C” by the owner, mortgagee, manager or lessee of the land described in Schedule “B” on the item described in Schedule “A”.

#### SCHEDULE “B”

All those pieces or parcels of land known as Lot 7300 and Lot 7301 DP 1170982, Lot 7315 and Lot 7316 DP 1175985, all Lots inclusive in Sections 1-8 DP 3117, Lot 1 DP 758716, Lot 3811 DP 766254, Lot 8 DP 1135578, Lot 3 DP 919337 in Parish of Moquilamba, County of Robinson shown on the plan catalogued HC 2733 in the office of the Heritage Council of New South Wales.

#### SCHEDULE “C”

Note: The following works are exempt from requiring approval under the *Heritage Act 1977* (NSW) and can be carried out without notification to the Heritage Council of NSW. These site specific exemptions do not exempt the need for approvals under different legislation (e.g. *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*, *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*).

If any unexpected historical archaeological deposits and/or relics or Aboriginal objects are discovered, works must cease in the affected area(s) and notification made immediately in accordance with the *Heritage Act 1977* (NSW) and *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*.

Prior to any works being undertaken in accordance with these site-specific exemptions, the impact on the Aboriginal cultural heritage values of the place is to be assessed by a person with culturally appropriate knowledge of the place, as deemed suitable by the Ngemba- Ngiyampaa- Wangaaypuwan- Wayilwan Native Title Applicants or Holders.

1. All Standard Exemptions
2. Installation of commemorative monuments, markers, structures or items if the design, scale and appearance is considered appropriate by Ngemba- Ngiyampaa- Wangaaypuwan- Wayilwan Native Title Applicants or Holders, and the structural integrity and placement is considered appropriate by Cobar Shire Council.
3. All works by Ngemba- Ngiyampaa- Wangaaypuwan- Wayilwan Native Title Applicants or Holders to repair, maintain and/or remove commemorative monuments, markers, structures or items.
4. Installation of interpretation signage if the design, scale and appearance is considered appropriate by Ngemba- Ngiyampaa- Wangaaypuwan- Wayilwan Native Title Applicants or Holders, and the structural integrity and placement is considered appropriate by Cobar Shire Council.
5. All works by Ngemba- Ngiyampaa- Wangaaypuwan- Wayilwan Native Title Applicants or Holders to repair, maintain and/or remove interpretation signage.
6. Any activities by Ngemba- Ngiyampaa- Wangaaypuwan- Wayilwan Native Title Applicants or Holders to collect, remove and/or relocate Aboriginal objects or remains in or outside of the site.
7. Any activities by Ngemba- Ngiyampaa- Wangaaypuwan- Wayilwan Native Title Applicants or Holders to repatriate Aboriginal objects or remains to or within the site.
8. Installation of temporary structures for events for a period of time considered appropriate by Ngemba- Ngiyampaa- Wangaaypuwan- Wayilwan Native Title Applicants or Holders.
9. Maintenance of existing post and wire fences relating to ongoing Mount Drysdale station pastoral activities
10. All works to maintain existing unsealed tracks relating to the ongoing Mount Drysdale station pastoral activities
11. Ongoing maintenance and desilting of Mount Drysdale station ground tanks to ensure water for stock and people
12. Removal of one small toxic mine waste dump relating to 1940's-1950's reworking of mine waste to prevent contaminants leaching into stock water.
