Public Health (COVID-19 General) Order (No 2) Amendment (No 7) Order 2022

Explanatory note

The object of this Order is to amend the Public Health (COVID-19 General) Order (No 2) 2021 to—

- (a) remove the requirement for QR check-in before entering certain premises, and
- (b) remove the current density limits on hospitality venues and nightclubs, and
- (c) remove singing and dancing restrictions that apply in relation to certain premises.

1 Name of Order

This Order is the *Public Health (COVID-19 General) Order (No 2) Amendment (No 7) Order 2022.*

2 Commencement

This Order commences at the beginning of 18 February 2022.

Schedule 1 Amendment of Public Health (COVID-19 General) Order (No 2) 2021

[1] Clause 9 Registration of contact details for funeral or memorial services and gatherings following services

Omit the clause.

[2] Clause 10 Registration of contact details for entry to certain premises

Omit clause 10(1)(a)–(j). Insert instead—

- (a) nightclubs,
- (b) strip clubs,
- (c) sex on premises venues, being restricted premises where sex between patrons is permitted on the premises,
- (d) music festivals with more than 1,000 attendees.

[3] Clause 10(4)(a1)

Omit the paragraph.

[4] Clauses 13A and 13B

Omit the clauses.
