Anti-Discrimination Act 1977

EXEMPTION ORDER

Under the provisions of section 126 of the *Anti-Discrimination Act* 1977 (NSW), an exemption is given from sections 8, 10, 25, 27, 49D, 49F, 49V, 49X and 51 of the *Anti-Discrimination Act* 1977 (NSW) to the Department of Communities and Justice to undertake the following:

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People

- Targeted support for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in preparation for recruitment processes.
- Targeted recruitment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people into senior executive roles.
- Targeted recruitment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people into entry-level employment programs including graduate programs, scholarship programs, traineeships, internships, and apprenticeships.
- Targeted recruitment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people into frontline service delivery roles.
- Targeted development programs for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people including targeted talent management and mobility programs, leadership development, coaching, shadowing and sponsorship development opportunities, and;
- Capability development, mentoring and connecting programs for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people leaders and potential leaders.

Women

- Targeted support of women in preparation for recruitment processes.
- Targeted recruitment of women into senior executive roles.

- Targeted recruitment of women into typically male-dominated roles across all areas of the department,
- Targeted recruitment of women into frontline service delivery roles.
- Targeted development programs for women including targeted talent management programs, mobility programs, leadership development, coaching, shadowing, and sponsorship development opportunities.
- Capability development, mentoring and connecting programs for women leaders and potential leaders.

People with a specific type of disability

- Targeted support for people with a disability in preparation for recruitment processes.
- Targeted recruitment of people with a disability.
- Targeted recruitment of people with a specific disability (i.e.: where the department undertakes a specific targeted talent program).
- Targeted recruitment of people with a disability into entry level employment programs including graduate programs, scholarship programs, traineeships, and apprenticeships.
- Targeted recruitment of people with a disability into frontline service delivery roles.
- Targeted development programs for people with a disability including targeted talent management programs, leadership development, coaching, shadowing, and sponsorship development opportunities.
- Capability development, mentoring and connecting programs for people with a disability at or post entry-level employment programs and making the transition from such programs into roles within the Stronger Communities Cluster.

Carers with specific carer's responsibilities

- Targeted development programs for carers including targeted talent management programs, leadership development, coaching, shadowing, and sponsorship development opportunities.
- Capability development, mentoring and connecting programs for carers at or post entry-level employment programs and making the transition

from such programs into roles within the Stronger Communities Cluster.

People from Racial, Ethnic, Ethno-Religious Minority Groups

- Targeted development programs for people from racial, ethnic, ethnoreligious minority group backgrounds including targeted talent management programs, leadership development, coaching, shadowing, and sponsorship development opportunities.
- Capability development, mentoring and connecting programs for people from racial, ethnic, ethno-religious minority group backgrounds into entry-level employment programs and making the transition from such programs into roles within the Stronger Communities Cluster.

Refugees and asylum seekers who are eligible to work in Australia

- Targeted support for people from refugee and asylum seeker backgrounds who are eligible to work in Australia in preparation for recruitment processes.
- Targeted recruitment of people from refugee and asylum seeker backgrounds who are eligible to work in Australia.
- Targeted recruitment of persons from a specific refugee and asylum seeker background who are eligible to work in Australia or that hold a specific refugee visa type (i.e.: where the department undertakes a specific targeted talent program).
- Targeted recruitment of people from refugee and asylum seeker backgrounds who are eligible to work in Australia into entry level employment programs including graduate programs, scholarship programs, traineeships, and apprenticeships.
- Targeted recruitment of people from refugee and asylum seeker backgrounds who are eligible to work in Australia into frontline service delivery roles.
- Targeted development programs for people from refugee and asylum seeker backgrounds who are eligible to work in Australia including targeted talent management programs, leadership development, coaching, shadowing, and sponsorship development opportunities.

 Capability development, mentoring and connecting programs for people from refugee and asylum seeker backgrounds who are eligible to work in Australia at or post entry-level employment programs and making the transition from such programs into roles within the Stronger Communities Cluster.

This exemption will remain in force for 10 years.

Anti-Discrimination Act 1977

EXEMPTION ORDER

Under the provisions of section 126 of the *Anti-Discrimination Act* 1977 (NSW), an exemption is given from sections 25 and 51 of the *Anti-Discrimination Act* 1977 (NSW) to CyberCX Pty Ltd to:

 conduct targeted advertising of women only to support their entry into the All-Women Academy Program in support of advancement and promotion of women in cyber security,

 offer graduate positions of Associate Consultants in Strategy and Consulting, Governance Risk and Compliance and Managed Security Services for women only in pursuance of a 50% workforce participation rate.

This exemption will remain in force for 5 years.

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Anti-Discrimination Act 1977

EXEMPTION ORDER

Under the provisions of section 126 of the *Anti-Discrimination Act 1977* (NSW), an exemption is given from sections 25 and 51 of the *Anti-Discrimination Act 1977* (NSW) to Essential Energy to designate, advertise and recruit approximately 30% of all Early Talent Pathway positions for female applicants only in pursuance of a 30% women workforce participation rate.

This exemption will remain in force for 10 years.

Gas Supply (Natural Gas Retail) Regulation 2023 – Notice of consultation under section 5(2)(a) of the Subordinate Legislation Act 1989

The Office of Energy and Climate Change (OECC) is inviting public submissions on a proposal to make the Gas Supply (Natural Gas Retail) Regulation 2023.

The proposed Regulation would replace the Gas Supply (Natural Gas Retail) Regulation 2014 which is due to be automatically repealed on 1 September 2023. The proposed Regulation will provide the necessary regulatory framework to support the *Gas Supply Act 1996*.

The objects of the Regulation are:

- to provide the necessary detail for retailers, reticulators and exempt persons regarding the delivery of the NSW Government's social programs for gas,
- to provide detail for reticulators regarding delivery of post-disconnection notices,
- to provide further detail on the civil monetary liability of scheme operators in certain instances.

The proposed Regulation keeps many of the existing rules, but is updated to reflect current practices, be simple and easy to understand, and fit for purpose.

CHARITABLE TRUSTS ACT 1993 NOTICE UNDER SECTION 15 CY PRES SCHEME RELATING TO THE JOSH WOOLFSON SCHOLARSHIP

Section 12(1)(a) of the *Charitable Trusts Act* 1993 (**the Act**) permits the Attorney General to establish a cy pres scheme to alter the original purpose of a charitable trust. Section 9(1) permits the application of trust property cy pres where the spirit of the original trust can no longer be implemented.

The Josh Woolfson Scholarship (**the Scholarship**) was established by an *inter vivos* gift to the University of Sydney (**the University**) by Mrs B E (Liz) Woolfson (**Mrs Woolfson**) in 2012 to endow in perpetuity one or more named undergraduate scholarships for students undertaking their final year of study in the Sydney Medical School. As at 25 September 2022, the Scholarship was valued at \$211,831.00.

Under the terms of the gift, the Scholarship was to be awarded to undergraduate students in financial hardship in their final year of study in the Sydney Medical School. The Sydney Medical School has existed since 1856 and forms part of the Faculty of Medicine and Health at the University. In 2014, the University replaced the undergraduate Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (**MBBS**) with a postgraduate degree of Doctor of Medicine. The last cohort of MBBS was in 2013. As the undergraduate MBBS is no longer offered at the University, the original terms of the trust have become impossible to fulfil.

The University holds the gift from Ms Woolfson on an express trust for the purpose of awarding a scholarship. Trusts for the establishment and award of scholarships for students at educational institutions or for study in a recognised field, such as medicine, are charitable as they fall within the charitable head of advancement of education.

As the University now offers medicine at a postgraduate level, a cy pres scheme is required to remove the requirement that a candidate or candidates must be an *undergraduate* student undertaking their final year of study in the Sydney Medical School. The proposed scheme would instead require that the candidate or candidates be undertaking their final year of study in the Sydney Medical School. The condition that the Scholarship would be awarded to a candidate or candidates in financial hardship would continue.

As the gift was expressly made for the benefit of medical students in their final year of study at the University who are in financial hardship, and noting it appears Ms Woolfson intended that the gift be for the benefit of medical students at the University, rather than any other University, the proposed new trust purpose is sufficiently close to the original purpose of the trust.

In these circumstances, the Solicitor General, as the Attorney General's delegate, has approved the establishment of a cy pres scheme to alter the original purposes of the charitable trust so as to enable the Scholarship to be awarded to students in financial hardship in their final year of study at the Sydney Medical School.

Take note that within one month after the publication of this notice any person may make representations or suggestions to the Attorney General in respect of the proposed scheme.
